OLDER SCOUT PROGRAMS

WOWOATAM: A High Adventure Trek for Older Scouts

This program is recommended for scouts who have been to camp a number of years and only want to work on a couple of merit badges. Sign-up for this program is on-line.

The WOWOATAM program went under a major revision in 2007. It was redesigned to offer your older scouts in camp a chance to earn a couple of Merit Badges plus explore the backcountry of Lost Lake and the surrounding area.

Wowoatam 1 will start on Monday of each week and will consist of two days and two nights in the backcountry of Lost Lake. The Scout can then take Merit Badges back in camp using blocks C and D. Wowoatam 2 will start on Wednesday of each week and will consist of two days and two nights in the backcountry of Lost Lake. The Scout doing this program should sign-up for Merit Badges using blocks A and B. If a Scout wishes to do both Wowoatam 1 and 2 they can do so but then cannot do Merit Badges.

Wowoatam 1: Team building events, bicycling, trapping, woods lore, tree climbing, GPS, backpacking

Wowoatam 2: Kayaking, black powder rifles, black smith shop, fishing, GPS, backpacking

A custom hat will be available for purchase only by the Scouts who participate in this program for the two days.

CHIPPY TRAIL:



The Chippewa Trail is a newly constructed trail encompassing the backcountry of Lost Lake Scout Reservation. It takes hikers through some of the most beautiful and pristine areas of camp that most people have never seen including the old horse coral, Duck Pond, the tree houses, Dock and Tom River, and Big Dollar Lake. Hikers will also encounter a variety of terrains along either the inner or outer loop of the "Chippy Trail".

The Chippy Trail is completely maintained and operated by the youth of Chippewa Lodge 29.

A variety of patches and medals may be earned from hiking the Chippy Trail. The inner and outer loop patches may be purchased at the Lost Lake trading post or at the Council Service Center. Trail medals may be earned and are awarded following approval of the Chippewa Trail Committee. There are several requirements and pre-registration required to earn trail medals. Forms will be available at camp.

CHIPPY TRAIL (continued):

Trail Medal (\$15)

- Hike the entire Outer Loop of the trail
- Stay overnight at the camp site at the old horse coral
- Perform at least 2 hours of trail maintenance
- Write a 600 word report explaining your experience on the trail, including likes and dislikes about the trail. Reports should be turned in to the Chippy Trail Committee.
- Submit a Trail Medal Completion Form, the trail medal fee, and reports to the Chippy Trail Committee.

Arrowman Trail Medal (\$15)

Members of the Order of the Arrow may choose to work towards a special medal offered for those who give extended service to the trail.

- Be an active registered member of the Order of the Arrow.
- Hike the entire Outer Loop of the trail.
- Stay overnight at the campsite at the old horse coral.
- Serve on a Chippy Trail crew or crews, performing a minimum of 20 hours of service on the trail.
- Write and submit an article for the Chippewan about your experience hiking the trail and/or working on the trail.
- Submit an OA Trail Crew Medal Form and trail medal fee to the Chippy Trail Committee.
